A baby animal needs constant care, attention and affection from its mother. In her absence, a fosterer will need to take over the role of providing round-the-clock care.

We remain the only animal welfare organisation in Singapore that does not turn away any animals brought in, but our shelter is not a place where newborn animals belong. Because of their low immunity, they are easily prone to illness and disease.

Therefore, we encourage the kind people who find these animal babies to foster them and eventually help find homes for them.
